Teen Teacher Job Description

- Time Commitment: One Semester to One Year
- Responsible To: Santa Clara County 4-H Program Representative
- Responsibilities: Direct delivery of the 4-H Youth Experiences in Science (YES) program to first, second, and third grade students at an after-school program once a week.
- Qualifications:
- Desire and ability to work with young elementary aged children.
 - Willingness and Ability to work as part of a team.
 - Openness to working with diverse populations.
 - Basic organizational skills.
 - Time to give 2-3 hours per week to the project.
 - Enthusiasm for the project and an openness to learn.
- Specific Tasks:
- Attend the 10-hour YES training.
 - Meet with the site team to plan and organize weekly science sessions.
 - Come prepared to the weekly sessions.
 - Teach hands-on science to students after school once weekly.
 - Meet regularly with the YES coach to assess the program.
 - Be encouraging and establish relationships with students. Contribute to the program evaluation at the end of the semester.

- Hands-on experience working with elementary school students.
 - Meaningful opportunity to serve others.
 - Opportunity to build leadership, decision-making and planning skills.
 - Earn community service credit.
