Santa Clara County How to Enrollment Guide: New and Returning Youth and Volunteers

New Youth Members

- A laptop or desktop is recommended.
- Select a local club and connect with the community club leader(s) to learn more about the club and project offerings.
- Create a "Family" profile on 4-H Online or join a "Family" that already exists if you are a younger sibling/family member.
- Sign-up for the project(s). You can add/update throughout the year.
- Pay annual 4-H <u>enrollment fee online</u> by credit card. Fill out the fee waiver form. 1
- Individual 4-H clubs, ranches and projects may collect an approved assessment for operating expenses. Fee waivers are available by request.

Returning Youth Members

- Login to the "Family" profile on 4-H Online using previous family profile email & password (do not create a new profile).
- Teens who would like to receive 4-H emails directly are encouraged to add THEIR contact info on their individual profile in 4-H Online.
- Sign-up for project(s). You can add & update throughout the year. Update any information that has changed (remove projects and clubs you are not part of this year) and re-enroll.
- Pay annual enrollment fee online by credit card or indicate if you are seeking a fee waiver on the payment survey.
- Pay club directly for any additional fees.

New Adult Volunteers

- · A laptop or desktop is recommended.
- Complete <u>4-H Volunteer Interest Survey</u>.
- Create an adult volunteer profile on 4-H Online or join your "Family" that already exists if your family already has a profile.
- Complete eXtension training: 2022-2023 California New Volunteer Course (Spanish version). Check your email from 4-H Online for Santa Clara County password.
- Complete fingerprint requirement by scheduling an appointment Complete "Applicant Information", print and take to your appt. Here is an example form.
- Pay the annual family enrollment fee online by credit card. If your children are enrolled, do not pay another family fee.

Returning Adult Volunteers

- · A laptop or desktop is recommended
- Update the adult volunteer profile on 4-H Online using previous family profile email & password (do not create a new profile). Re-enroll and remove projects & clubs you are not part of this year.
- Complete eXtension training 2022-2023 California Returning Volunteer Course (20 mins). Check your email from 4-H Online for SCC password.
- Pay the annual family enrollment fee online by credit card. If your children are enrolled, do not pay another family fee.
- If you have not previously, please complete the 4-H Volunteer Interest Survey.

You will receive an automated email after you enroll in 4-H Online stating that "enrollment has been submitted" and "is not yet complete." You will become "ACTIVE" once all enrollment steps are completed.

Pro Tips

- When completing your 4-H online screening?'s, be sure to answer #4 with CA (or other state). DO NOT enter your whole driver's license # or it will be returned to you.
- Contact information in 4-H Online is how the county 4-H office knows how to reach you. Please make sure this information is accurate.
- Only one family member can use the same email as the family profile email (the one used to log into 4-H Online) update all of your member's email address.
- Volunteers should indicate if they are a project leader in 4-H Online. This is how the report is generated to communicate to project leaders & submitted to the Fair.
- Returning Volunteers are covered by UC insurance through Dec 31, 2022. After Jan 1, 2023, you are no longer protected by UC unless you re-enroll.

2022-2023 Annual Enrollment Fees

One Youth & family fee = \$120.

Two Youth & family fee - \$200.

Three Youth & family fee - \$280.

Four Youth & family fee - \$360.

Adult Volunteers, no fee

Youth Enrollment Fee Waiver request is available.

Members and volunteers should complete reenrollment by November 15th. New members may join at any time. An approved enrollment is required for participation in 4-H projects.

4-H Branding Resources

Did you know there is a 4-H Brand Toolkit?

The toolkit is designed to share branding resources with 4-H volunteers in California. The goal is to maintain a consistent 4-H brand identity throughout the University of California 4-H Youth Development Program. This is an essential resource to use when creating flyers, newsletters, and 4-H Club swag.

Some Key 4-H Pro Branding Tips:

- 1) All uses of the 4-H name and emblem must follow the USDA guide for proper use of the name and emblem.
- 2) When using the term "4-H" it is to be written as the numeral 4" separated from a capital "H" with a hyphen. (not 4H, but 4-H)
- 3) You can also refer to 4-H youth as "4-H'ers". Always use an apostrophe after "4-H" when this is used.
- 4) Use the UC 4-H logos on flyers, handouts, apparel, and banners used to communicate about the 4-H program.
- 5) Use a logo format with a transparent background when placing the UC 4-H logo on a background other than white. For a dark background use the white version; for a light background use the black version.
- 6) The 4-H Brand Toolkit has templates available for your club flyers and project flyers.

On September 17, Sunset 4-H was among the thousands of volunteers that showed up at waterways across the state to help pick up trash at the 38th annual California coastal cleanup.

This statewide event helps to keep trash out of the local ecosystem and rivers, which in turn helps keep the ocean clean. This is important because several species of wildlife like turtles and marine birds easily get tangled up in plastic waste or eat it and get very sick.

Since 1985, when the event first began, more than 26 million pounds of trash from California's outdoors have been removed.







California Coastal Cleanup continued

This year, Sunset 4-H helped increase this number by picking up more than 50 pounds of trash. This was a mix of the regular plastic wrappers and bottles, but with some more memorable pieces too. There were landscaping posts, bike tires, chairs, and as a new addition, many, many masks.

Gloves, bags, and breakfast were provided by the Santa Clara County Water District. This event was a great and very fun way to give back to the community!




