Are you exhibiting at the fair?



This year as you are planning your animal pen decorations and club themes, please be sure to use the correct 4-H branding. The Santa Clara County Fair is an annual event that brings a lot of public attention to the incredible things our 4-H members are involved in. What message are we providing to the public?

Here are some guidelines to bring consistency and statewide branding to our signs and decorations.

- 4-H has a dash in it. That is the registered name, 4-H. So be sure to remember the dash in your signs and any flyers.
- The 4-H clover is a federal mark and is authorized for use according to the guidelines found in the branding toolkit. http://4h.ucanr.edu/Resources/Branding_Toolkit/

- Standard 4-H branding toolkit emblems may be used in your printed sign.
- Please email me directly if you would like a sign template to use, I will forward one to you.
- The preferred branding includes 4-H, University of California, and UCCE information.
- It's also helpful to provide a point of contact. You may use the SCC4hprogram@gmail.com address in your signs, or a club email.
- Please let me know if you need any help with developing your signs.
